**PARENTAL PERMISSION AND ACKNOWLEDGEMENT OF
CONDITIONS FOR PARTICIPATION IN PROGRAM**

1. I, we, parent or authorized guardian of the child named above give permission for his/her participation in **(circle all that apply): Basketball Cross Country Softball Track & Field Volleyball Cheerleading** and related activities, including but not limited to transportation to and from games or practice sessions.
2. I, we agree to direct my/our child to cooperate and comply with reasonable directions and instruction for CYO staff or adult volunteers leaders (caches).
3. I, we, agree to be responsible for all medical expenses relating to injury of my/our child as a result of his/her participation in any sport activity, whether or not caused by the negligence of parish, school, or CYO program employees, agents or volunteers or other participants.
4. I, we, understand that children competing in athletic and recreational sports programs risk injury to the body, psyche or property damage to themselves and others. Such injuries can be caused by teammates, other persons or accidentally or intentionally self inflicted, faulty equipment or facilities, conditions of recreational facilities or the schools or parishes where sports activities are held, vehicle accidents while in transport of through the activity itself. Protective equipment used in a sports activity is not a safeguard against injury.

RELEASE AND WAIVER OF LIABILITY AND INDEMNITY AGREEMENT

In consideration for being permitted to participate in the sports activities of CYO, use the equipment provided and to enter the premises or facilities or the: Diocese of Oakland (Diocese) for any purpose including observation and participation in activities, the parent or guardian for him or herself and any successors in interest and on behalf of the minor child agrees:

1. To release, waive, discharge and promise not to sue the Diocese of Oakland, and its affiliated entities, its offices, directors, employees, agents and volunteers (hereafter referred to as "Releases") from all liability for any loss or damage, and any claim or demands therefore on account of serious or mortal injury to the body, injury to psyche or property of the minor child, or undersigned parent or guardian, whether caused by negligence or other conduct by the Releases while the minor child, parent or guardian is participating in CYO sports activities or in upon or about the premises or the Diocese or any of its facilities or equipment.
2. To indemnify and hold harmless the Releases from any loss, liability, damage or cost it may incur due to the presence of the minor child, parent or guardian in, upon, or about the premises or the Diocese, its facilities or equipment, or while participating in any CYO Sports activities whether caused by the negligence or Releases or otherwise.
3. That the parent or guardian has read this Agreement, voluntarily signs the Agreement and that no oral representations, statements or inducements apart from the contents of this written Agreement have been made.

CODE OF CONDUCT AGREEMENT

The Catholic Youth Organization (CYO), through the vehicle of sports, provides youth with an opportunity to practice Christian attitudes and responsibilities and to become friends with other children throughout the diocese. CYO activities should be examples of the meaning of Christian sportsmanship. The guiding principle behind the enforcement of this code is that the behavior of everyone involved in CYO should not detract from the childrens' enjoyment of the sport.

1. COACHES

Acceptable standards of coaching behavior include:

- Set a good example for participants and fans to follow, exemplifying the highest moral and ethical behavior;
- Respect the judgment of officials, abide by rules of the event;
- Treat opposing coaches, participants and fans with respect;
- Instruct participants in sportsmanship and demand they display good sportsmanship;
- Coach in a positive manner, reflecting Christian values;
- In basketball and volleyball, remain seated on the bench at all times except in the instances in the National Federation Basketball Rule book.

Penalties:

- Any coach ejected from a game because of unsportsmanlike conduct will be suspended for the next two games and may be subject to additional penalties.
- Any coach who physically abuses another person may be suspended for the remainder of the season and may be disqualified from CYO participation
- Any coach who physically abuses an official will be suspended for the remainder of the season and may be disqualified from CYO participation.

2. PLAYERS

Acceptable standards of participant behavior include:

- Treat opponents with respect; shake hands prior to and after contests;
- Respect the judgment of officials and abide by the rules of the contest;
- Accept seriously the responsibility of representing the school or parish by displaying positive behavior at all times;
- Play in a positive manner, reflecting Christian values. Do not bait or taunt opponents.

Penalties:

- Any player ejected from a game because of unsportsmanlike conduct will be suspended from the next game and may be subject to additional penalties.
- Any player who physically abuses another player, participant or official may be suspended from play for the remainder of the season and may be disqualified from CYO competition.

3. SPECTATORS

Acceptable standards of spectator behavior include:

- Remember that the players are children and are playing for their enjoyment, not yours.
- Remain seated in the spectator area during the games;
- Respect decisions made by contest officials;
- Be a role model by positively supporting teams and by not shouting instructions or criticism to the players, coaches or officials. Do not coach from the stands;
- Make no derogatory comments or gestures to players, coaches, parents of the opposing team, officials or league administrators.

Penalties:

- Participating teams and their coaches are responsible for the conduct of their spectators.
- Any spectator who displays poor sportsmanship may be removed from the facility by an official, their team coach, a league official or the host gym person-in-charge.
- Any spectator who interferes with the conduct of a CYO activity may, at the discretion of the spectator's parish, league, or the Oakland Diocese, be barred from attendance at subsequent CYO activities.

4. ENFORCEMENT

The parishes and leagues, under the supervision of the Diocesan CYO Office, shall enforce this code. Complaints regarding violations of this code shall be first brought to the attention of the athletic directors of the parishes / schools involved. Coaches, participants or spectators may be placed on probation or suspended from CYO activities for their actions.

Our Lady of Guadalupe CYO Boys Basketball and Cheerleading – 2010/2011 Season

Important Information

“Leased” Uniforms: Beginning with the 2010-2011 season, a \$60 refundable fee is included in the registration fees for basketball players on 4th and 5th grade teams. This fee will be refunded by check, via US Mail, when the player’s full uniform is returned in GOOD CONDITION to the Player Agent or Athletic Director, after the last game of the season (regular season or playoffs). The deadline for returning uniforms is March 13, 2011.

Fundraising: “Candy” Fundraiser: ALL basketball players and cheerleaders must participate in the “Candy” fundraiser. A player or cheerleader may “buy-out” of the “Candy Fundraiser for \$40, payable at registration. “Buy-outs” will not be accepted after the last player registration date (TBA). If not “buying-out,” all “Candy” Fundraiser moneys are due to the Treasurer by the published due date. **Enforcement:** Players are not allowed to play in regular-season or post-season league games until all “Candy” Fundraiser funds have been delivered to the Treasurer.

“Shoot-a-Thon” Fundraiser: All basketball players must participate in the Shoot-a-Thon Fundraiser. The fundraiser will be held at Our Lady of Guadalupe School’s Harvest Festival (Date, TBD). Shoot-a-thon details, date, and time will be delivered to each Team Parent at the first Team Parent meeting. Families may NOT opt-out of the Shoot-a-Thon fundraiser. Players will be given information on other fundraising efforts by the Team Parent.

“Hardship” Requests: Our Lady of Guadalupe’s CYO Boys Basketball program is self-funded and does not utilize parish funds for operating costs. To ensure financial stability is sustained, the boy’s basketball program is able to support a finite number of hardship registrations for the 2010/2011 season. Hardship registrations are reviewed by the CYO boy’s basketball board and awarded following the Oakland Diocese policy for prioritizing player registrations:

1. Our Lady of Guadalupe School Students
2. Our Lady of Guadalupe Religious Education Students who are current students and were students in the 2009-2010 year
3. Children who live in the Our Lady of Guadalupe Parish boundaries

Player Drafts: The American Division Head Coaches in each grade level will select players to complete their rosters. Remaining players will be placed on National Division teams. If there are enough remaining players to field two or more National Division teams, a separate draft will be conducted with each of the National Division Head Coaches alternating draft picks until all remaining players have been assigned to a team.

It is the intent of the program to have children play in their own grade division. Players may be given the opportunity to play up one grade to fill teams with less than ten players. This opportunity will be granted by the decision of the Boys Basketball CYO Board. The 3rd grade American Division team will be comprised of players who attend 3rd grade at the time of the final registration date. Players in Grades 1 and 2 will play on 3rd Grade teams. However, 1st Grade players will be assigned to a “waiting list” and will be placed on a National Division 3rd grade team(s) with less than ten players.

SAFE ENVIRONMENT TRAINING (SET): All new basketball coaches and cheerleading coaches and advisors must complete SET this season. More information on the online training: <http://www.oakdiocese.org/safe/workshops.htm>

Coach Selection: The selection of Our Lady of Guadalupe coaches is the responsibility of the Athletic Director. A panel consisting of the Player Agent, Coaching Coordinator, and Athletic Director will select coaches for each team. Factors taken into account will center on willingness, past adherence to the CYO Code of Conduct, and needs of the program.
